· Pap Smear Screening begins at age 21 regardless of when sexual activity starts. Adolescents/young women 20 and below are not recommended to have a Pap test or HPV testing. Pap screening may end at age 65 if the Pap history is unremarkable and the patient is low risk. · Screening recommended every 3 years for women 21-29. Women 30-65 and ...

The new cervical screening test procedure is similar to a Pap smear test. For both tests a doctor or nurse takes a sample of cells from the cervix. However, the Pap smear test used to look for abnormal cells in the cervix, while the cervical screening test looks for HPV infection.

At age 25, women should have an initial primary HPV test (an approved test for high-risk strains), cotesting with an HPV test and a Pap smear, or Pap smear only. For those who have normal results, an HPV test or cotesting should be repeated every five years until the age of 65. (If only a Pap smear is done, this should be repeated every three ...

The test can be done by itself or at the same time as the Pap test (called a co-test) (with the same swab or a second swab), to determine your risk of developing cervical cancer. The American Cancer Society recommends a primary HPV test* as the preferred way to screen for cervical cancers or pre-cancers in individuals 25 to 65 years with a cervix.
