The starting point for a good 60mm telescope with a fixed eyepiece is £250. Add £100-150 for a zoom eyepiece. From £250 to £500, you will find better telescopes and this is the starting range for the instruments with larger objective lenses. Over £500 buys you a telescope of the highest quality.
